Midday School Care (TSO - *Tussen Schoolse Opvang*)

Sometimes children don't stay at school every day for lunch and instead go home or eat with a friend. If your child is not staying for lunch on a specific day, but normally does, you must communicate this to the teacher. The teacher will then pass this information on to the TSO employee. If children have not been signed out with the teacher, the child is not permitted to leave during the midday break and will remain at school.
